2.8 Archeology

- .1 Protect and preserve known archaeological features that are important to the history of the site or district. Protect known archeological materials whenever possible in their natural or original position. Document and record archaeological sites for future generations.
- .2 Minimize disturbance of the terrain to reduce the possibility of destroying unknown archaeological materials and habitation levels.
- .3 Undertake necessary investigations using professional archaeologists and contemporary methods when it is not possible to preserve archaeological materials in their natural or original position.
- .4 It is not appropriate to use heavy machinery or equipment on sites where their presence might disturb archaeological materials.
- .5 Stop work on a job immediately if archaeological resources are unexpectedly uncovered during construction activity. Notify the Planning Department and the State Historic Preservation Office.
