


TAR RIVER PADDLE TRAIL

The basin-wide Tar River Paddle Trail starts near the headwaters in Person County and flows 196 miles to the US 17 bridge in Washington NC where it becomes the Pamlico River. Multiple local governments and the NC Wildlife Resources Commission manage the individual access points along the paddle trail. Please contact the managing agency for the most up to date information. Paddlers must assess their skill level, equipment and river conditions before entering the water.
